› Temporary TAFE Teaching Facility

Teaching Facility

The unique requirements of the North Sydney Institute of TAFE's temporary teaching facility challenged Australian Temporary Structures | ATS to scope a solution that (a) is compliant with the Building Code of Australia's 'High Class Building', (b) caused minimal impact on the existing building and grounds (c) could be delivered in a short timeframe and tight budget and (d) took into account the requirements of multiple stakeholders.

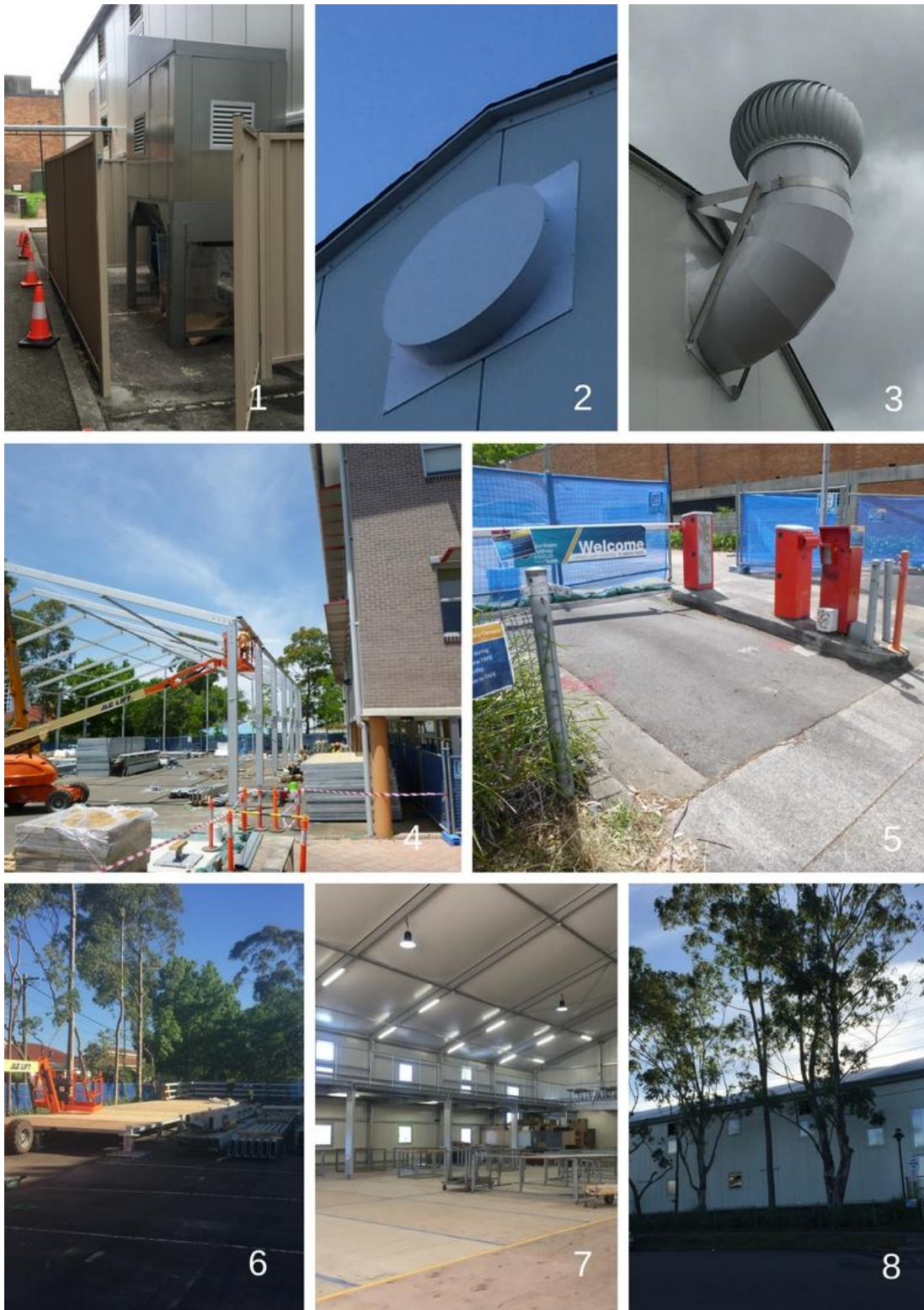
Roads and Maritime Services NSW engaged The Australian Temporary Structures | ATS team to build a temporary teaching facility to accommodate their carpentry courses. ATS built a 25m x 40m L Series Structure with a mezzanine level.

The temporary facility was purpose-built on the TAFE's bitumen car park. ATS's 1000sqm temporary modular industrial flooring provided the client with significant cost savings by allowing the floor to be easily removed once the building is no longer required; allowing the carpark to remain undamaged.

The build was achieved in the 6 week deadline, whilst accommodating the time and noise restrictions placed on the location due to the nature of the site (school), neighbouring businesses and proximity to a main, busy road and railway.

Access to the site was extremely tight and specialized installation methods were adopted to access the site and assemble the building. Stakeholder engagement was a key factor in the design and assemble of the structure to ensure all parties' requirements were accommodated.
